DAVID CREEVEY

A recent graduate from Dublin Conservatory of Music and Drama, where he studied with John Feeley, David Creevy has been honoured with multiple awards. He won the *Patrick Flood Award* for the best Guitar Recital and was runner up in the *Yamaha European Guitar Foundation Prize*. He was also the recipient of the *George Loudon J.S. Bach Guitar Prize* and the *Senior Guitar Prize*.

His competition success led to a performance in the John Field Room in the *National Concert Hall*, after which he was invited to perform for the President of Ireland, Mary MacAleese. In 2003, Creevy's was selected as a finalist in the *Stotsenberg International Classical Guitar Competition* in America. He is the first Irish guitarist to be among the top twenty players of his generation. Following that competition, Creevy was invited to study with *Christopher Parkening*. He was selected as one of six students from around the world to perform for *Parkening* at his annual Master Class in California.

He has also participated in master classes with guitarists such as Carlos Bonell (Spain), Nigel North (U.K.), Scott Tennant (USA), Fabio Zanoni (Brazil) and Alan Neave (Scotland).

Creevy offers audiences a unique experience. His programmes include his own arrangements of the 17th century Irish Harpist, *Turlough O'Carolan* and other Celtic music. He also plays the Spanish repertoire, modern music from Russia, Japan, California – and from his favourite composer Johann Sebastian Bach. Creevy is recognised as Ireland's most talented young guitarist. The *Irish Times* have written "...Creevy is a sensitive musician with a knowing sophisticated side...a strong technique with an ability to define layers in a multi-line texture...". *Parkening* proclaims that "David Creevy is a very talented young classical guitarist. An instrument speaks from the heart of a player and it is this young man's heart that speaks when he plays".

Friends of the Museum is a multinational, multicultural organisation that arranges a wide range of cultural and social events for the Portuguese and International community in the Algarve. The interests and activities of our members are very wide and include: art, literature, dance, music, photography, gardening, bridge, tennis, walking. There is also a lively discussion group, film club and video presentations of operas.
